Hold fast the confession of our Hope! - Hebrew 10:23

Days like these, hope may be hard to come by.

We are in our third week of quarantine, and only now are we beginning to see the effects that such a shut down over the fears of a virus spreading may have. The economic impact is only beginning, and we hear of those in our community who have lost their jobs or are currently furloughed and have no regular income. With every news report and paper, we hear only the bad news. With the schools closed, graduations and athletic aspirations are put on hold, and we're unsure what this means for their future. We are anxious, full of worry for our friends and family. We are scared to go out, tired of staying in, and all of this could go on for another month.

Hope is hard to find.

But it is here.

Throughout the New Testament, this word "hope" keeps coming back up. It's as if God knew that His people would need to be encouraged, to put their hope and trust in Him, so His word gives us a constant reminder to be people of great hope.

The author of Hebrews writes, "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (Heb 11:1). In Romans 8, Paul reminds us that "we hope for what we do not see." Hope is an expectation for that which we cannot have now, but is the deep longing of our hearts.

But hope is more than just wishful thinking. I hope I can eat an entire tub of ice cream without gaining weight... that is a fool's hope. It is not based in reality, it has no substance behind it, and such a hope will only lead to disappointment (and pants that don't fit).

Genuine hope is the conviction of faith that rests in the promises of God (Acts 26:6). We take God at His Word. What He promises to do is as good as done already, we can, with confidence, put our hope in Him. Hope is established, not on fanciful wishing, but on every promise of God's Word. He said it, and I place my hope upon it.

Hope is also built upon the history of God's provision. I can look through the history of God's dealing with His people and see that God is faithful to His Word. Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 1:10, "He delivered us from such a deadly peril, and he will deliver us. On him, we have set our hope that he will deliver us again."

Our hope is in the Gospel. It is the hope, the sure and certain conviction, that through Christ Jesus, our sins are forgiven and we have the promise of everlasting life. We have this hope, that He who has begun a good work is faithful to bring it to completion (Phil 1:6). We hope that as He has delivered us from evil, He will also continue to work within us His sanctifying grace, that we may grow more and more like His Son. We wait, patiently in hope, awaiting the coming righteousness (Gal 5:5) and going for the day of our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God.

Do not lose hope. Stay deeply rooted in God's Word, flood yourself with His promises for you in Jesus Christ, and rejoice in the hope of the glory of God (Rom 5:2). The hope you have in God will never disappoint, will never lead you to shame (Rom 5:5).

Like everyone else, the virus has caused us to change a lot of the ways that we do things. I was at a mission conference last month in TN (my wife's home church). I was set to attend the MTW West Coast mission conference in April to represent Indigenous Ministries of North/Mission to the World. Those present were Pastor Sayler, Marlyn Bunger, Gene Valentien, Jim Wipf, and Bob Steadman. A quorum was present.

MSA the minutes of the February 11, 2020 stated meeting as corrected.

Church statistics:

Communion was served to 124 on March 1, 2020.

Marlyn Bunger prayed for the work of the Deacons.

Church committees:

Church use: Gene Valentien reported on requests to use the church building.

Christian Ed: Jim Wipf presented the schedule and updates on the Christian Ed Banquet. The material for VBS is being ordered.

Missions: Paul & Liz Meiners will be our speakers for our Mission Emphasis Day in October. A possible change in the budget is being readied as Ross & Ellen Errington are retiring as missionaries in June. A couple from our presbytery is seeking support to serve with the PCA in Cambodia. They are being invited to speak at Ebenezer possibly in April.

Worship & Music: Discussion on Holy Week services resulted in the decision to pursue for 2021 a series of Sunday Evening Services leading up to Easter in which local reformed ministers would be invited to preach, with the possibility of meeting in different community churches each week.

MSA that the Session put forth on the Sunday before the celebration of the Lord's Supper a reminder to communing members of the standards of self-examination in preparation for the Sacrament, and set aside a day of prayer and fasting during the week before the Lord's Supper.

Jim Wipf prayed for the committees.

Pastor Sayler gave his report. He participated in an online interview with a possible pastor for a church plant in St Cloud, MN. Pastor Sayler is temporarily filling in as the teacher for the 7th & 8th grade S.S. class and continues with the communicants' class for this age group. He is beginning a discipleship class for men that will meet twice a month on Tuesdays.

Pastor Sayler shared a summary of the Called Meeting of Siouxlands Presbytery on March 6, in which the Presbytery voted to create an Interim Session to oversee the ministry of CityLife Church, St. Paul, MN.

As recommended by the Judicial Commission at the 118th meeting of the Siouxlands Presbytery, the Session reviewed the Report of the Ad-Interim Committee on Divorce and Remarriage.

The Session discussed health concerns regarding the spread of Covid19 (Coronavirus) and what changes, if necessary, should be implemented. No action was taken, but we encourage members to consider their health, and that of others, before coming together.

The request for Ebenezer to be part of the L.O.V.E. INC ministry in the Lennox community was taken off the table from the February session meeting. MSA for Ebenezer to be part of this ministry and for Pastor Sayler to sign the necessary form.

The next stated meeting will be on April 14, 2020 at 7:00 pm

Prayer concerns were shared.

The meeting was closed with prayer by Bob Steadman and Pastor Sayler at 9:15 pm.

Taste and See That the Lord is Good

Apple Cream Pie

Mina Poppens

2 1/2 - 3 cups peeled, cubed or diced apples

3/4 cup white sugar

2 Tablespoons flour (heaping)

1 egg, beaten

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 cup heavy cream

Mix together the above ingredients and put in your favorite 9 inch unbaked pie crust. Bake at 325 degrees for 45 minutes.

Topping

Mix together while the above is baking:

1/2 cup white sugar

1/3 cup flour

1 teaspoon cinnamon

1/4 cup softened butter

Remove the pie from oven after baking for 45 minutes and add the topping Then return to the oven and bake for another 15 minutes, watching carefully so it doesn't over brown.

This can be served hot or cold and is great with ice cream or whipped topping. This is a favorite Mina enjoys making with fresh apples, but this can also be made with fresh peeled peaches or frozen apples too (if using frozen, drain excess juice.) This is oh so good!!! This pie freezes well, so it can be made ahead.


